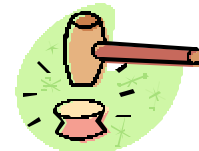

1979

General meetings were held at the St. Aidan's church, 17405 NE Glisan. Joe Michaud-WA7OEM was the President.

The third annual banquet was held at Earl Kelly's. Cost was \$5.25 per adult. 80 people attended.

Hoodview entered the Coliseum hobby show for the second time. WA7WBE-Jim and others participated.

WB7AUF-Art was communication coordinator for the March of Dimes Walkathon. Three stations were used and four operators.

Club campout at Cape Lookout State Park was held on July 14-15.

Saturday morning breakfasts were held at Elmer's with 20 or more attending.

There were 25 students in the spring Novice class. W7GUR-Jim and WB7OZI-Orville helped nine students get their Novice tickets in the Fall class.

Club information net met on Wednesday night at 7:30 PM on 28.825 MHz.

WA7YCY-John was Hoodview news editor and WB7RAQ-Donna was assistant news edi-

tor. New newsletter staff started in August. They were WB7USF-Joanie, WB7SUQ-Mary; and WB7QQQ-George.

At each monthly meeting a swap/sell/buy table was set up in the back of the meeting room.

Field Day 1979 on Larch mountain was June 24-25. Ed Clulow was chairman with 46 operators scored 7074 points.

Donations of \$1000 were received to plan for the club repeater to operate on 147.28/.88 MHz. Club repeater committee: Chairman: WB7AUF-Art; Vice Chairman: KA7DCQ-Vern; Secretary: WB7RAP-Nels; Treasurer: WA7IIM-Armand; Legal Advisor: W7DYS-Bill; Technical Coordinator: WB7BDD-Bob.

President Joe, WA7OEM and Pat became proud parents of a baby girl, Morgan Marie, on August 3.

HARC changed the meeting place to Mt. Hood Community College, room 1303, starting in October.

Club dinner-dance was held December 8th at Poor Ol' Dan's Turfside.

1980

HARC provided public service communication during the January ice storm. WB7RAQ, WB7NBO, WB7AUF, WB7UFJ, KA7EEU, WB7PHV, and WA7OEM were some of the members who were involved.

W7DYS-Bill was elected President of HARC. Others elected: V.P. WB7OYD-George; Secretary WB7RAQ-Donna; Treasurer WB7USF-Joanie. Board of Directors: W7TTL-ED, WB7SRU-Jay, and WB7OZI-Orville.

Hoodview held its fourth annual club banquet

at Holiday Inn at Coliseum exit.

For the third year HARC had a booth at the Chamber Music Society's Hobby air. WB7UFJ-Denny was chairman of the booth.

Club campout was at Ft. Stevens State Park, August 16-17. KA7HIO-Cheryl headed up the event.

Club repeater was put in operation at a 202nd Avenue location.

Club Picnic was held at McIver Pak on September 6th. WB7WOE-Ed was in charge.

Club has a P.O. Box number at the Parkrose Station, POB 20624, Portland, OR 97220.

Field Day was on June 28-29 with W7TWL-Ed in charge. We had 43 operators manning the seven stations for Field Day. Results were first in the call area and seventh in the nation.

HARC was called to set up a station at the Hansen Building for Multnomah County Emergency Services to assist Dr. Palmer, a Geology professor at Portland State University to collect ash samples from Mt. St. Helens. The club repeater was used for communications. WB7NBO and WB7NBP were the net operators.

WB7WOE-Ed took over as editor of the newsletter starting in August. WB7QQQ-George was assistant editor and WB7SUQ-Mary handled the art. W7IXZ-Larry and his xyl W7IYA-Nancy became co-editors of the newsletter with the December issue.

HARC and Mt. Hood Community College presented "Amateur Radio and our Community" was held in the Vista drawing room. This was called 'Super Thursday'. The event was co-chaired by WA7YCY and WB7NBP.
