This can be attributed to our redesigned website, which makes it easier for folks to join. However we also can attribute it to our ham classes.

New hams are the corner stone of our group growing. New hams face many challenges, and those challenges. We as a club need to help guide them through. It is why we are here, and will help us grow. The big hurdles new hams seem to run into with their licenses is two fold. First how to program and use their new radio and license. The second is where to find radio activity. Both of these questions recently licensed and seasoned hams can help with. Many of you newer hams have purchased inexpensive radios and have developed the knack for programming these radios, and may know where to find repeater activity. Us seasoned hams have the knowledge to support the technical issues these new hams run across. Many of them seem simple to us, but to the new ham is can be a road block that they need to navigate. We all need to keep in mind that, the book side of preparing and taking your license exam doesn't always translate very well to actual real world practice.

The established hobbyists, we'll call them Elmers (sticking with ham nomenclature), also known as mentors. Yes, even those who have been at it for 2, 3, 4 or 5 years could be considered mentors. We, as a club have experience with at least getting on 2 meters, 70 cm and working repeaters. Everyone should make it a point to recognize new sequential call signs on our repeater, or anywhere else they encounter a new ham. Doing so will help you be an ambassador for the club. YAESU FT-901 DM -\$600

The **Yaesu FT-901DM** is an excellent HF transceiver covering 160 to 10 meters (and WWV 5 MHz re-



ceive). Coverage includes: 1.8-2, 3.5-4, 7-7.5, 14-14.5, 21-21.5, 28-28.5, 28.5-29, 20-29.5, 29.5-29.9 MHz. Modes include: LSB, USB, AM, CW, FM and FSK. Passband tuning is continuously adjustable from 300 to 2400 Hz. This radio does not have general coverage receive. There is a built-in speaker.
