

June is upon us! SeaPac was a huge success. We had tons of fun and our flea market table did excellent. The next big thing is Field Day. We have some exciting things going on this year! First of all the biggest news, the mountain is open to the public and all are invited. As usual we are looking for volunteers for setup, takedown, and the 24 hours of operation. We'd love to work the whole 24 hours. The more help we have, the smoother things go.

If you have never been to field day, or are a new ham, this is the event for you. We will have 3 HF stations setup, and a GOTA (Get on the Air) station. Of those 3 stations we tend to operate in a hybrid mode. We will 2 Voice/CW stations, and then a dedicated digital station. In the Digital tent, we'll be operating FT8 and FT4 (the new Joe Taylor mode). On Friday evening Bryan and I will be running a digital mode workshop from 8PM to 9PM on Friday night. Everyone is welcome to join us for the workshop.

In our 3 HF stations or even on the GOTA station everyone will have to opportunity to operate on HF. You can also log contacts for an operator first to start to get acquainted with how HF works. The whole event is a great way to spread radio, get your

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Field Day—June 21st-23rd

We will have towers, radios, generators, and fun. The mountain is open and everyone is invited to join us.

The Hoodview ARC Field Day site on Larch Mountain is not a campground. There is no running water or camping facilities. This is a remote hilltop where we will set up and dry camp. Please do not Suggested Packing List: let this scare you! Come up to camp or drive up for the day. It is always fun and quite the learning experience.

You can reach the site by crossing the Stark Street bridge, turn right and go past Corbett. Once you pass the Women's Forum take a right onto Larch Mountain road and go to the top. The snow gate is open.

Unless you have made prior arrangements with another camper, please come self contained. I have included a packing list below. We will have a portable toilet at Extra Clothes Bug Repellant the Hoodview site.

The club will have a hospitality table set up with coffee, water and some snacks. Please bring a snack to share and a gallon of water.

If you would like to caravan up the hill on Friday. June 21st, please meet at Corbett High School to caravan up the hill (time will be announced at the meeting) so that we can arrive up on the hill together by 11:00. We need people to help set up on Friday from 11:00 AM - 5:00 PM. This is a great way to learn about putting antennas together, checking the SWR, and raising towers. You are on your own for lunch on Friday.

The club will be providing Friday night's dinner. And Breakfast on Saturday morning. After this meal you are on your own because of different operating times.

Friday night we will set up the radios and test them all out by operating. Fun time! Shaun and Bryan have offered to show us how to use digital radio.

Saturday, we will have a short meeting at 10:00 to go over procedures. We will start operating at 11:00 AM and go for 24 hours. Or as much as the bands and our bodies will allow.

We will have four stations ready to make contacts: 15-40 meter all mode (Len's camper); 20-80 meter all mode, operator's choice (Joel's tent with Jim); a digital station (Bryan and Shaun) and a Get-On-the-Air (GOTA) station set up during daylight hours. There will be a network so that we can use the bands efficiently. We want you to come and join us in the fun.

Take down starts at 11:00 am on Sunday. We will need some extra bodies to help get the towers down safely and antennas packed away. Hopefully we will be off the hill by 2:00.

This is on of the biggest on-the-air event for Hoodview. More volunteers are needed for set-up, operating, and tear down, then come to the meeting. Remember that for working (set-up, operating, logging, take-down) two hours on two different days you will earn a field day pin.

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Field Day History

Our club started all because of Field Day in 1976. Some local hams got to together to play radio in the ARRL Field Day Contest. Art Zehner W7AUF was the first chairperson. Other current members who have been chairperson are: Armand W7IG (1989 & 1998), Denny WB7UFJ (co-chair 1989), Cory KA7IUG (1990, 1991, 2002, 2003, 2015), John W7SIR (1996), Millie W7MIP (co-chair 1998), Joel N7LF (2000, 2001), Cheri N7KOJ (2000, 2001), Jim KA7AGH (2005, 2006, 2008), Scott N7DOD (2014). My apologies if I left anyone off the list.

We have operated in the class of 6A, 5A, and recently 4A. We use to have separate stations for CW and Phone. Along with VHF and UHF stations.

The favorite cookie at Field Day is the chocolate chip cookie. Barry W7BLC declared it the club cookie. We have had other treats at the hospitality tent but we are always open for other donations. In the past, all members were requested to bring up a gallon of water. The club purchased a "car garage tent" after using a cemetery tent borrowed from Rose City Cemetery.

Prior to the club purchasing the trailer for our towers we stored them at member's houses each year. On Wednesday or Thursday night prior to Field Day we had a tower party to load them onto borrowed flatbed trailers to haul them up the hill.

A club member who worked for Multnomah County Roads use to grade the parking lot a week prior to our visit. We have also had light towers from a local tree logging outfit in the parking lot and one year we had a huge power plant generator. The most unusual vehicle was a dump truck with a tower welded into the bed.

Bonus points have changed over the years from natural power, publicity, served agencies, elected officials, APRS, ATV, and now Social Media. It was great the year the Red Cross showed up with their brand new canteen truck to cook dinner for everyone.

Over the years, we have been very lucky with our safety. A few cuts, bruises, but nothing too serious. Even the year when a home-brewed square tower folded over under the weight of the antennas, no one got hurt. Scary! However, we did offer first aid and communications to 911 for car accident victims on Larch Mountain Road. We have also gathered extra people to look for a lost child who walked away from Cory KA7IUG a church outing in the upper parking lot.

In 1992, we had to shut down all operating because of a lightning storm that came over the mountain. We have had snow and blazing hot weather. There have only been two years that we have not been able to make it to Larch Mountain because of road closure. We relocated to Cherryview, east of Sandy in 2008 and in 2014 we went to Estacada.

We have always gotten permission to camp and to operate from Larch Mountain. However when the Scenic Gorge Commission was established we have had to go through a few more steps. People have slept in their cars, truck beds, tents, trailers, motor homes or even just sleeping bags on the ground.

Other historic happenings was recently when the port-a-pottie didn't show up. That was not a good year.

Only the old timers will remember the pen and paper dupe parties where we had to hand enter all of the calls for each band and cull out the dupes. The parties were held about a week later and sometimes lasted into the wee hours of the mornings. This was prior to the Commodore 64. Denny wrote a program to find dupes on his computer but all the calls had to be entered back here in Portland. It use to take a day to run the program.

The club had a Field Day song, penned by our own Pammy KC7Q. It was to the tune of "On Top of Spaghetti." It was once a Top-40's hit.

And last year (2018) for the first time in Hoodview history our Field Day site was not open to the public because of the forest fire of 2017. Only members of Hoodview were allowed onto Larch Mountain Road pass the snow gate at mile marker 10.

Our highest year for contacts was in 1989. We had 4149 contacts and 47 participants. In 2008, when we located to Cherryville, under the powerlines we only had 594 contacts. And our fewest participants were in 2012 with only 26 members.

Pictures were in black and white and you could see Mt. Hood. Each year holds historical memories

and you can share in these moments by joining us on Larch Mountain next weekend for Field Day.
