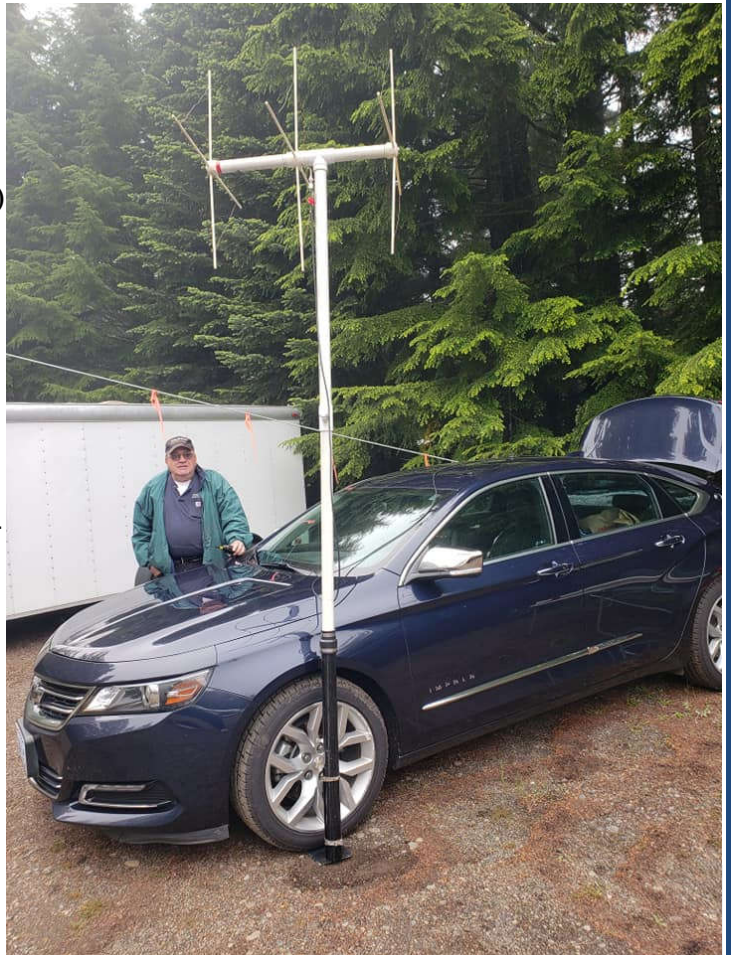
In no small part was our spot on the mountain secured by Joel N7LF. Without his work, we would be operating in a parking lot ;)

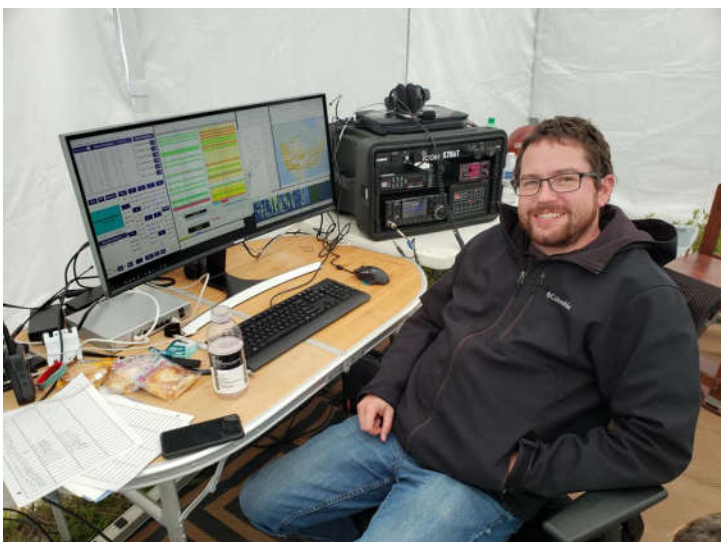
field day pins and pay pal fees.

We have some bills that will need to be paid when Shaun returns from vacation like the port-a-potty, food for the hospitality and money to Multnomah Search and Rescue.



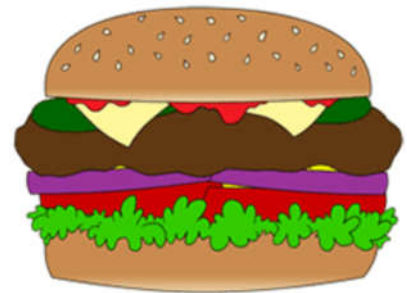
