This trip was on the bucket list, so we did more tourist type activities, over relaxation. I did however research the prospect of radio operation while in Japan. Japan is one of the more difficult parts of the world to get a reciprocal license. The primary thing you need to have is an address to ship your license to in Japan, once you apply. The fees are not inexpensive either, and they have far more restrictions than U.S. hams have. Their restrictions are more power related. I didn't get a license to operate, but our next adventure abroad we'll look for a radio opportunity.

We did however see many operators' antenna setups in our travels. I took many pictures of space restricted antenna setups. We also visited several radio 'candy' stores in Akihabara, Tokyo. Akihabara, also known as the 'electronic' mall, is really a place you should visit if you ever get the chance. There are vendors there that specialize in certain types of electronics, and components. The interesting thing is, that is all the individual vendor sells. One of them, that I saw, sold only RF chokes and Ferrite cores for transformers. Another one sold only relays and switches. It felt like a mall where you could find any electronic component, but each vendor specialized in their components they sold. We didn't allocate enough time to see everything there. You could spend a couple days in Akihabara and not see everything there.

While there, I found a very compelling limited space HF antenna, that I believe I can build. I wanted to buy it because it was inexpensive compared to our antennas. I however, didn't think it would be easy to get it home without damage. I do however think it would be a great antenna for portable operations, or stealthy operations at home. I plan on sharing pictures of our adventure soon.

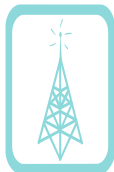

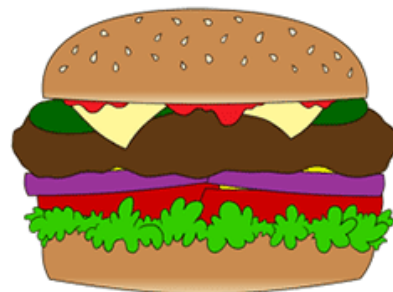
