




type. Badges are under \$10 and have many options.

Check into Two Hoodview Nets

The Hoodview Amateur Radio Club Information Net has been expanded to include the Club's 443.475 + UHF repeater. The tone is the same as the 28 machine 167.9. The UHF Information Net will follow the

VHF net at 7:45 PM or after the VHF net if it goes past 7:45 PM. This is an attempt to assist more local amateurs in checking in to our Club's Net and broaden our exposure. Club members are encouraged to volunteer to be net control of either net.

HARC-2 M net on 147.28 MHz, at 7:30pm. HARC—70cm net on 443.475 at 7:45 pm

Net Check-In Raffle

To increase check-ins on the Hoodview Net we are going to do another raffle this year. In this raffle you can earn tickets by checking into the net every Wednesday. You will get one raffle ticket per Wednesday, for checking into one of the HARC information nets. The dates you can earn a raffle tickets is from October 2nd through December 4th. There are no penalties if you can't check-in during the net on a given week, you just won't get a raffle ticket. You must be a current member of HARC to receive a raffle ticket.

- As soon as the 2 Meter Net starts at 7:30, until the 440 net wraps up but it is highly encouraged that new hams or hams without their own radio's visit a station to checkin.
- Net Control regularly offers his station to assist new net control operators.
- Ask another club member, and someone will be happy to get you on the air as well. I am more than willing to offer up my station to allow a ham to check-in to the net.

All check-ins count for 1 raffle ticket per night. You can check-in to 2 meters, 440, or both, you will get 1 raffle ticket for that evening.
