General Club Meeting on May 21st at 7:30 PM. We will have a virtual meeting. See newsletter, page 5 for details. Bummed that we can't see each other.

May is upon us, and 2020 is turning out to be an unprecedented year. The club is faced with significant challenges being a social group in the world of Corona Virus. We've had to adapt, and part of the adapting we've done is getting on the air more, and doing virtual club meetings. We'll continue to take these measures until we can get together again in a social setting. There was great participation for our first virtual meeting, I do believe though we can get more members online. To help get you online with us, we'll hold a couple pre-meetings prior to the next general meeting. The pre-meetings are intended to help you get setup, and navigate joining the online meeting session. Look for pre-meeting and club meeting invitations coming to your email, just like our monthly newsletters.

For our May General Virtual Club Meeting, we'll be discussing several topics that the board wants to hear from the membership. First on deck is Field Day, we want help coming up with ideas for event. The ideas must take physical distancing measures into account. Some floated ideas so far include still going to Larch Mountain (this will still require a permit to be issued by the Forest Service), but each station would be responsible for their own setup, takedown, and logistics. Another idea floated was to turn it into a club contest, where members run their own field day from home or another location. The club contest would run on the number of contacts or points made by the individual station. We hope to hear from our members if they have any ideas or further input.

The second subject we need to work on for May is discussing the board elections. As it stands now, Kate Brown has laid out a plan for gatherings over 25 individuals. Those gatherings will be restricted until at least September. And with the college closed we may need to wait that long. With that, we want to discuss how the general membership would feel completing elections for replacing board members that resigned earlier this year. The ideas we have are vote via mail, or voting via online survey. We can get into the details at our general meeting.

We are continuing to hold our technical classes, just on the air. It's the 4th Saturday of the month at 9 am, on the 147.28/88 repeater. We will have one again this month, and it is an open round table. We'll do our best to answer any of your questions, or connect you with a subject matter expert that can help you one on one, physically distant (of course). The board has also briefly discussed holding virtual Technician licensing classes instead of in person classes as well. Once we get more details worked out, we'll be sure to share with everyone.

I personally hope that everyone is happy, healthy, and staying safe.

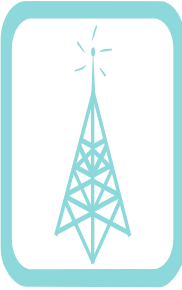


VE Session Canceled

HARC—70cm net on 443.475 at 7:45 pm

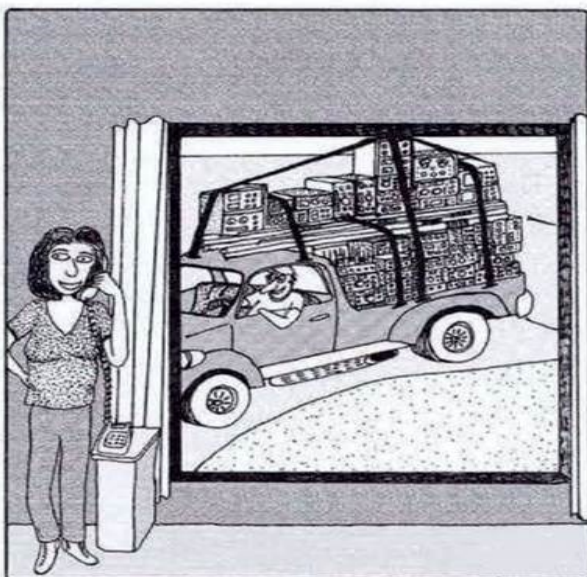

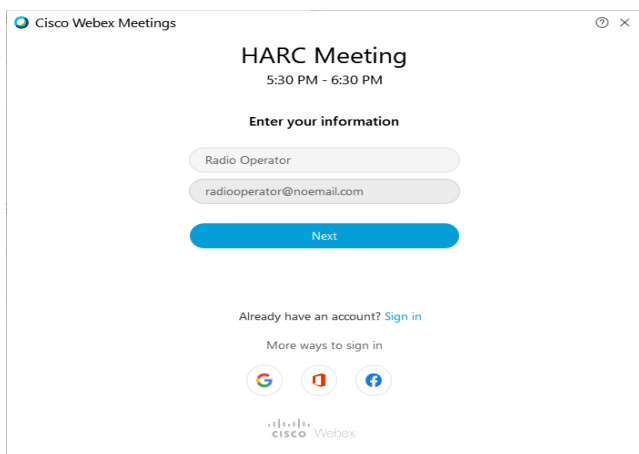

Joining a HARC Webex Virtual Meeting

Click the 'Join Meeting' link in the email you received from Hoodview Amateur Radio Club. You will be prompted to download the Webex Meeting Client, if you do not already have it. Once it is downloaded open the file.

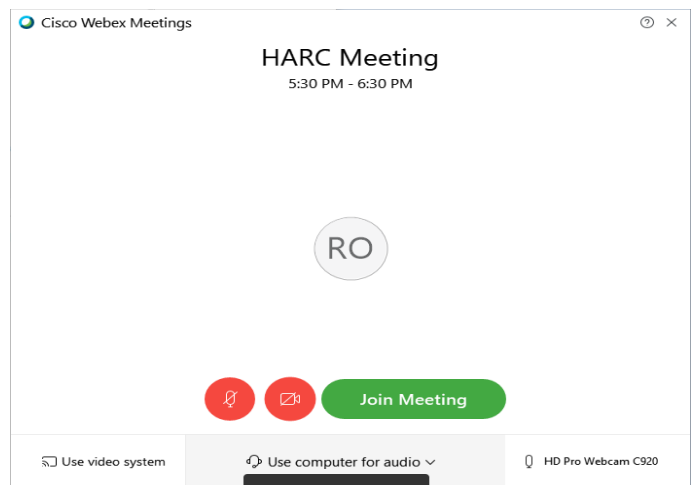


You will get a new window that asks for your Name and Email Address. Please enter your name and an email address, as this allows us to track attendees.

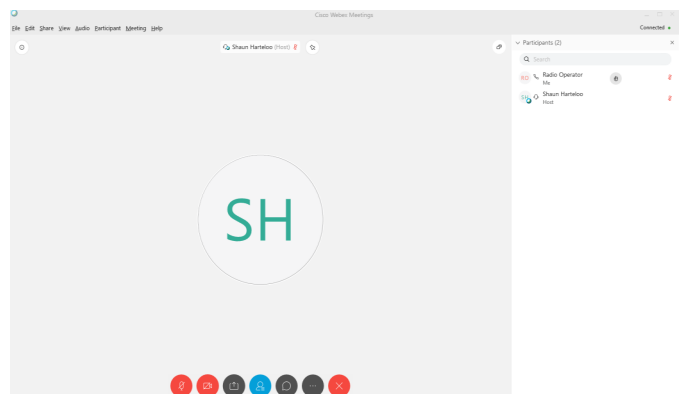


Click on Next, and then select to disable video, and mute your microphone. This is a best practice for HARC meetings to reduce background noise (mute TV, music, cell phones) and bandwidth usage.

You can use your computer for audio, or dial in with a telephone. Select from the drop down in the middle what you plan on doing, and follow the instructions. The call in details will pop up once you click on join meeting.



Once you are in the meeting you can control meeting settings like mute, and other features with the 7 circles at the bottom center of the webex application. You might have to move your mouse over webex to see the options in the window. See below.



From the ARRL—Field Day 2020 — A Time to Adapt

Many individuals and groups organizing events for **Field Day 2020** have been contacting ARRL for guidance on how to adapt their planned activities in this unprecedented time of social distancing and uncertainty.

“Due to the unique situation presented this year, this can be an opportunity for you, your club, and/or group to try something new,” ARRL Contest Manager Paul Bourque, N1SFE, said. “Field Day isn’t about doing things the same way year after year. Use this year to develop and employ a new approach that is in line with the current circumstances.”

Social distancing and state and local requirements very likely will impact just how — and even whether — you are able to participate in Field Day this year. ARRL continues monitoring the coronavirus situation, paying close attention to information and guidance offered by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). If social distancing means that Class A with a 30-member team set up in a city park won’t work this year, then it’s time for a Plan B. Part of the Field Day concept has always been adapting your operation to the situation at hand. At its heart, Field Day is an emergency communication demonstration. Field Day rules are flexible enough to allow individuals and groups to adjust their participation and strategies in a way that still addresses their needs while being fun. Some possibilities:

Encourage club members to operate from their home stations on emergency power (Class E).

- Use the club’s repeater as a means for individual participants to keep in touch during the event.



- Family members interested in operating Field Day and unable to participate as part of a larger group may want to consider setting up a portable station in the backyard with a temporary antenna.

One big impact this year will be a decline in public visibility and any interaction with the visitors. Prudence may dictate dispensing with the ham radio PR table to attract passersby, should you set up in a more public location. It’s okay not to score all the bonus points you may have attempted in the past. Local and served agency officials may be unwilling to visit, which is understandable under the circumstances. Do be sure to reach out to them as part of your preparations and remind them that you look forward to continuing your working relationship with them in the future.

The impact will differ from place to place, so ARRL recommends that all amateur radio clubs participating in Field Day stay in regular contact with local or state public health officials for their advice and guidance on hosting Field Day activities.

Demonstrating an understanding of the health crisis we all face and your willingness to adapt will show that you and your club or group are good working partners with local or served agencies.

“With any emergency preparedness exercise, it’s not about adapting the situation to your operation, it’s about adapting your operation to the situation that presents itself,” Bourque said. “Try something different. Learn something new about how you prepare. It may be a challenge, and you may have to ask yourself if you’re up to the challenge. We hope to hear you on the air over the June 27 – 28 weekend.” — *Thanks to Paul Bourque, N1SFE, and Dan Henderson, N1ND*
