

Winter Driving Preparedness

The first step to driving carefully during the winter season is to always be aware of changing weather conditions from your starting location to your destination. Check out our Road Trip Planner, a helpful tool that provides weather information for your drive, including forecasted conditions and severe alerts along the road.

Create an emergency car kit.

It is best to avoid traveling, but if travel is necessary, keep the following in your car:

- Cell phone, portable charger, and extra batteries
- Items to stay warm such as hats, coats, mittens, and blankets
- Emergency blankets or sleeping bags
- Windshield scraper
- Shovel
- Battery-powered AM/FM radio with extra batteries and HAM RADIO
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- Water and snack food
- First aid kit with any necessary medications and a pocket knife
- Tire chains and tow chains or rope
- Canned compressed air for tire repair
- Cat litter or sand to help tires get traction, or road salt to melt ice
- Booster cables with fully charged battery or jumper cables
- Hazard or other reflectors
- Bright colored flag or help signs, emergency distress flag, and/or emergency flares
- Road maps
- Waterproof matches and a can to melt snow for water

Get your car ready.

Have maintenance service on your vehicle as often as the manufacturer recommends. In addition, every fall, the following handy steps will help you ensure that your vehicle is safe to drive during winter weather:

- Have the radiator system serviced or check the antifreeze level yourself with an antifreeze tester. Add antifreeze as needed.
- Replace windshield-wiper fluid with a wintertime mixture. Install new wipers if needed.
- Make sure the tires on your car have adequate tread and air pressure. Replace any worn tires

and fill low tires with air to the proper pressure recommended for your car (typically between 30-35 psi).



- Keep the gas tank near full to help avoid ice in the tank and fuel lines.
- Keep your car in good working order. Be sure to check the following: headlights, heater, defroster, brakes, brake fluid, oil and power steering fluids, ignition, emergency flashers, exhaust, and battery.
- Properly lubricate door locks that may be prone to freezing. Use Tri-Flow and not WD-40.

Driving Safety And Driving Smart

Before beginning your trip, check the current road conditions and weather forecast. For statewide highway information 24 hours a day checkout your state's Department of Transportation

- Keep your car's windows, mirrors and lights clear of snow and ice
- Buckle up
- Allow yourself plenty of time to make it to your destination
- Be aware of sleet, freezing rain and potentially icy areas
- Brake early and slowly and avoid slamming on the brakes
- Keep a safe distance of at least five seconds behind other vehicles and trucks that are plowing the road
- When driving on ice and snow, do not use cruise control and avoid abrupt steering maneuvers
- When merging into traffic, take it slow —
 Sudden movements can cause your vehicle to slide
- Don't pass a snowplow or spreader unless it is absolutely necessary — treat these as you would emergency response vehicles
- Keep an emergency winter driving kit in your car
- Maintain at least a half tank of gas during the winter season. This is good for emergency preparedness and it keeps the fuel line from freez-

Joining a HARC Webex Virtual Meeting

Click the 'Join Meeting' link in the email you received from Hoodview Amateur Radio Club. You will be prompted to download the Webex Meeting Client, if you do not already have it. Once it is downloaded open the file.

You will get a new window that asks for your **Name** and Email Address. Please enter your name and an email address, as this allows us to track attendees.



Click on Next, and then select to disable video, and mute your microphone. This is a best practice for HARC meetings to reduce background noise (mute TV, music, cell phones) and bandwidth usage.

You can use your computer for audio, or dial in with a telephone. Select from the drop down in the middle what you plan on doing, and follow the instructions. The call in details will pop up once you click on join meeting.



Once you are in the meeting you can control meeting settings like mute, and other features with the 7 circles at the bottom center of the WebEx application. You might have to move your mouse over WebEx to see the options in the window.



ARRL: Day of Recognition

From the ARRL Arizona Congresswoman Introduces National Amateur Radio Operators Day Resolution

US Representative Debbie Lesko of Arizona has introduced a resolution designating April 18, 2021, as National Amateur Radio Operators Day, to recognize the important contributions of amateur radio operators.

"Amateur radio operators are critical in times of crisis and our communities are safer thanks to their dedication to sharing important information with the public," Lesko said. She was approached to introduce the resolution by 12-year-old Raymond, N7KCB, from Peoria, Arizona.

"I started Long Distance Responders so I can help prepare the community for emergencies with amateur radio," said Raymond. "There might be a price for a radio, but the ability and knowledge to help someone is truly priceless."

As Lesko's resolution notes, World Amateur Radio Day (WARD) is celebrated annually on April 18 to commemorate the founding of the International Amateur Radio Union (IARU) in 1925, and she said her resolution recognizes the amateur radio community with a national day in the United States in 2021. The resolution cites the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES®) for providing "invaluable emergency communications services following recent natural disasters, including but not limited to helping coordinate disaster relief efforts following Hurricanes Katrina, Wilma, and Maria and other extreme weather disasters."
