ARRL Field Day: Joel filed the permit application for FD on Larch Man with the Forest Service. Joel will re-file if restrictions changes, but expects the permit to be approved with similar restrictions as 2020. If thing change for 2021 Joel asked Chris if he was able to tow trailer to the hill. Chris is currently uncertain, but will make effort.

Used Radio Gear: The Multnomah county radio shop offered gear to HARC as a donation. Joel went to pick it up. So far 3 truckloads of gear was picked up, there is one load left. We need to inventory, and determine what is worthy of sale and what needs to be thrown away. Joel suggested that we allow members to pick through prior to trashing. Joel wants to send a thank you letter to the county, and Cory says she has club stationary.

Report Motions: Members should make motions to accept the treasurers report at general meetings. This is to allow member participation.

Repeaters: Joel reported that 3Ghz may still have an amateur allocation, and we may not need to decommission our 3ghz link between MHMC and Mt Scott. Jim and Joel plan on adjusting channels being used and using the link to provide Jim's DMR repeater on Mt. Scott with an internet connection. This will apply usage of the link which will 'stake a claim' on the spectrum space. Chris asked that Jim and Joel continue work on establishing the voting receiver system.

The Tree: Jim asked Rob if there was plans to continue gathering at the 'Tree' on Stark and Troutdale Rd on Saturdays. Rob said yes, and Cory said she would put it on Facebook. Shaun said he would send an email to the members.

Our goal was to make some changes to the constitution that the Oregon Department of Justice suggested. We have worked hard on the wording for each proposed change. We also checked out the regulations in the Oregon State Statues for non-profit organizations and we researched other ham radio constitutions.

According to our current constitution we have laid out this timeline to work on the current proposals.

- March 18th—General meeting, first reading and discussion. DONE.
- April newsletter will also include the proposed

changes for members to read.

- April meeting second reading and vote if no new changes.
- May 1st submit constitutional changes to DOJ and Secretary of State with incorporation renewal. And the one year anniversary of the DOJ recommendations.

On March 20th, Hoodview Amateur Radio Club VEs held their first ham radio test session in a full year because of Covid-19. New health protocols were established including temperature checks of both the VEs and the candidates, assigned seats, and preregistrations (no walk-ins). We were able to do the testing at the Troutdale Community Church thanks to K0INE Gary Brumbelow, who is a club member and pastor at the church.

We had ten test takers and eight of them passed which gave us six new techs and two generals.

The VEs for the day were Pam KC7Q, Denny WB7UFJ, K7GNR Henry, and KA7AGH Jim (picture taker).

Our next VE session will be on May 15th. If you are a VE examiner that would like to help, please contact Pam KC7O. She will be coordinating the volunteers for that session. We must keep our numbers down so only those scheduled to volunteer can be in the room.

VE Testing for Ham Licenses

Exam Candidates: You are RE-QUIRED to register in the FCC CORES system and receive a FCC Registration Number (FRN) before exam day. Candidates could go directly to the FCC CORES User Account and Registration page: https://apps.fcc.gov/cores/ userLogin.do. VECs are required by the FCC to submit your FRN with your license application form. New license applicants should create an FCC user account and register their Social Security Number (SSN) in the FCC Commission Registration System (CORES) before attending exam sessions. Registrants will be assigned an FRN which will be used in all license transactions with the FCC.

Effective on June 29, 2021, amateur radio licensees must provide the FCC with an email address on all applications. If no email address is included, the FCC may dismiss the application as "defective." Once an email address is provided, the FCC will email a link to an official electronic copy of the license grant. An official copy will also be available at any time by accessing the licensee's passwordprotected Universal Licensing System account.

Joining a HARC WebEx Virtual Meeting

Click the 'Join Meeting' link in the email you received from Hoodview Amateur Radio Club. You will be prompted to download the WebEx Meeting Client, if you do not already have it. Once it is downloaded open the file.

You will get a new window that asks for your **Name** and Email Address. Please enter your name and an email address, as this allows us to track attendees.



Click on Next, and then select to disable video, and mute your microphone. This is a best practice for HARC meetings to reduce background noise (mute TV, music, cell phones) and bandwidth usage. You can use your computer for audio, or dial in with a telephone. Select from the drop down in the middle what you plan on doing, and follow the instructions. The call in details will pop up once you click on join meeting.



Once you are in the meeting you can control meeting settings like mute, and other features with the 7 circles at the bottom center of the WebEx application. You might have to move your mouse over WebEx to see the options in the window.

World Amateur Radio Day (WARD) 2021

World Amateur Radio Day 2021 is Sunday, April 18. On that day in 1925, the International Amateur Radio Union was formed in Paris. Today, the IARU is a

worldwide federation of national amateur radio organizations. The IARU has chosen "Amateur Radio: Home but Never Alone" as its 2021 theme, acknowledging the many ways throughout the COVID-19 pandemic that amateur radio has remained a welcome respite for its variety of activities and opportunities -- even helping overcome online fatigue and social isolation. ARRL has information to help all radio amateurs plan for World Amateur Radio Day.


Clarification of FCC \$35 Fee Collection Start Date

Contrary to what you may have heard or read, the collection of application fees for the amateur radio service and certain other services will NOT begin on April 19, 2021. Although April 19, 2021 is the date the rules in the FCC Report and Order adopted last December generally take effect – i.e., one month after the R&O was published in the March 19, 2021 Federal Register – certain parts of those rules, including collection of the application fees for the amateur radio service, will NOT begin on that date. The effective date for new amateur radio fees has not yet been established. The FCC explicitly states in the published notice that the fees will not take effect until: the requisite notice has been provided to Congress; AND the FCC's information technology systems and internal procedures have been updated; AND the Commission publishes [FUTURE] notice(s) in the Federal Register announcing the effective date of such rules. The League's counsel for FCC matters estimates that the effective start date for collecting the fees will be some time this summer, but regardless of the exact timing we will have advance notice.

Keep in mind that one can only renew their amateur license within 90 days in advance of the expiration date. If you, or a club station license you are trustee for, are within that 90 day window now, I'd renew as soon as possible to avoid the new fee. If you are thinking of switching to a vanity call sign, I'd also seriously suggest you apply for that special call sign sooner rather than later. 73; Mike W7VO

7QP QSO Party!

The 15th annual 7QP will run this year on Saturday, May 1. Based on number of logs received last year, 7QP is the 3rd largest QSO party in the country and growing. For the past several years we have had all 36 Oregon Counties on the air. All kinds of 7OP info is available at



www.7QP.org. One reason 7QP has been so successful it that we share the weekend with three other QSO parties: New England, Indiana and Delaware. We use the same exchange format, we have unique county codes, and we sort contacts that don't count in scoring so you can send your log to all four without having to edit your log, just copy their whole exchange. Covid 19 is still among us and will probably impact some of the multi-ops. I put a Covid-specific allowance for those who want to try a "distributed multi-op", the only constraint is that all stations must be within the same county.

Remember the digital category or in mixed mode. Any digital contact counts 4 points! We can help out all those guys looking for Oregon on RTTY or PSK. The digital modes provide another way to get new operators with modest stations into the activity on HF. Unfortunately FT4 and FT8 will not work, the 7QP exchange is not compatible. And if you log on a computer, please email us a copy of your log even if you don't care to compete for an award. It helps us score the event. A convenient Web Form is available to paste your log into.

Suggestion: If you are not using a computer logging program, now is the time to get into it. Even if you are using another program to track your QSOs, DXCC, etc, you can easily export your log from N1MM back into it when the contest is over. Not only that, there are three other QSO parties that also use our weekend. N1MM is the only one that will let you log their exchange as sent. You can then enter these by sending your log to them. It helps us and them too.

Talk it up when you can to your local club about the 7QP. Your support and enthusiasm for this event is the backbone of the participation in Oregon. And remember to put May 1st on your calendar so you don't get pre-scheduled. I look forward to hearing from you and, as always, thanks for your support of the 7QP. 73, Dick Frey, K4XU,
