D Our Second Year Under Covid

The HARC Field Day at Larch Mountain will unfortunately again be a low-key event this year. As of June

10th, the Board is only aware of three club members that have committed to camping at Larch Mountain between June 25th – 27th and another five that offered to drive up to help with erecting and taking down any club towers and antennas. The Board has decided that no club towers and antennas will be erected this year due to the expected low participation but stations can may use verticals and wire antennas. The Board also decided not to order a port-a-potty and have the club trailer pulled up the hill.

This means the club members that are willing to participate on Larch Mountain will need to plan on being completely self-contained with their own radios, cables, antennas, generators, shelter, food, water and restroom facilities. This is completely opposite of past HARC Field Days that usually included five club towers with large Yagi mono-band antennas, five or more operating stations, a hospitality tent and a Friday night potluck dinner social gathering with 40 plus club members in attendance throughout the weekend.

The good news is that we won't need to mess with the gate because Multnomah County roads opened the upper portion of Larch Mountain Road earlier. Also the forest service pit toilets are open.

Remember, that you can still participate in the 2021 Field Day from home or another location. See the ARRL Field Day website www.arrl.org/field-day for details. If you do plan to get on the air, consider combining your 2021 Field Day Entry with the HARC W7Q entry by going to http://field-day.arrl.org/fdentry.php and using Hoodview ARC in the Club or Group Name data entry field.

Hopefully next year the HARC Field Day will be "back to normal," especially for any new club members attending Field Day for the first time.

ARRL to Extend Field Day Rule Waivers

The COVID-19 pandemic-modified **ARRL Field Day** rules from 2020 will continue this June with the addition of a power limit imposed on Class D (Home Stations) and Class E (Home Stations-Emergency Power) participants. The news from the ARRL Board's Programs and Services Committee comes as many clubs and groups are starting preparations for Field Day in earnest. Field Day 2021 will take place June 26-27.

For Field Day 2021:

- Class D stations may work all other Field Day stations, including other Class D stations, for points. This year, however, Class D and Class E stations will be limited to 150 W PEP output.
- An *aggregate* club score will be published just as it was done last year. The aggregate score will be a sum of all individual entries that attributed their score to that of a specific club.

ARRL Field Day is one of the biggest events on the amateur radio calendar. Last summer, a record 10,213 entries were received.

With the greater flexibility afforded by the rules waivers, individuals and groups will still be able to participate in Field Day, while still staying within any public health recommendations and/or requirements," Bourque said.

The preferred method of submitting entries after Field Day is via the web applet. The ARRL Field Day rules include instructions on how to submit entries, which must be submitted or postmarked by Tuesday, July 27, 2021.

VE Testing for Ham Licenses

You are REQUIRED to register in the FCC CORES system and receive a FCC Registration Number (FRN) before exam day. Candidates could go di-

rectly to the FCC CORES User Account and Registration page: https://apps.fcc.gov/cores/userLogin.do. VECs are required by the FCC to submit your FRN with your license application form. New license applicants should create an FCC user account and register their Social Security Number (SSN) in the FCC Commission Registration System (CORES) before attending exam sessions. Registrants will be assigned an FRN which will be used in all license transactions with the FCC. Also, effective in June an amateur radio licensee must provide the FCC with an email address on all applications. If no email address is included, the FCC may dismiss the application as "defective." Once an email address is provided, the FCC will email a link to an official electronic copy of the license grant. An official copy will also be available at any time by accessing the licensee's passwordprotected Universal Licensing System account.

How to Handle Repeater Interference

Repeater Jamming or other Interference Issues

- 1. Please do not acknowledge transmissions from unlicensed stations or stations causing the interference.
- 2. Please do not discuss the repeater interference on the AIR. If you are being interfered with, you are required to simply sign off and leave the repeater immediately. Continuing to use the repeater or arguing with the jammer eggs on the jammer.
- 3. Contact the repeater committee (Jim KA7AGH or Joel N7LF) off air to report the interference. Be prepared to report the time, your location, signal strength, the type of antenna you were using, and if directional, the direction in degrees from your station, you are receiving the offending signal from.
- 4. Let the trustee/repeater owners handle interference problem. There may be action that you are not aware of that is being handled.

While using our repeaters and dealing with jammers, do not add to the situation by making disparaging or snide comments about any repeater owner/trustee. Users of any repeater system may find it interesting to note that repeater owners have the legal authority to ban problem users from their repeaters and coordinated frequency pairs on a suspension or permanent basis *for any reason at any time*. Besides legally banning you from the repeaters and frequencies, owners reserve the right to file an corresponding FCC action against the offending station.

Intentionally transmitting simultaneously with another station or 'stepping on' is prohibited by FCC regulation...even if the intent is good-natured kidding among friends... It is still unlawful.

Proper and legal operating etiquette is really about common sense. While the above limits on content are not all inclusive, they should make clear the type of communications which are allowed on the repeater system and which are not allowed. Any activity in violation of FCC rules and/or any other Federal, State or local laws or ordinances (including, but not limited to jamming, "stepping on", broadcasting of music, unidentified carrier etc.) is against our 'Repeater Use Policy'.

Joining a HARC WebEx Virtual Meeting

Click the 'Join Meeting' link in the email you received from Hoodview Amateur Radio Club. You will be prompted to download the WebEx Meeting Client, if you do not already have it. Once it is downloaded open the file.

You will get a new window that asks for your Name and Email Address. Please enter your name and an email address, as this allows us to track attendees.



Click on Next, and then select to disable video,

and mute your microphone. This is a best practice for HARC meetings to reduce background noise (mute TV, music, cell phones) and bandwidth usage. You can use your computer for audio, or dial in with a telephone. Select from the drop down in the middle what you plan on doing, and follow the instructions. The call in details will pop up once you click on join meeting.



Once you are in the meeting you can control meeting settings like mute, and other features with the 7 circles at the bottom center of the WebEx application. You might have to move your mouse over WebEx to see the options in the window.
