Family Initiative

I love hearing about all the events HARC has done. The field days where there are seven stations transmitting, parcels of children running around, and an unending potluck. Where every other weekend was a camping trip and Pota expedition. As we have aged all those kids have grown up and had children of their own. It is time that we focus on bringing those families back into the club and back into ham radio. I propose that we take the next year and make it our focus to building up community interest and involvement with HARC. This will need to be a whole club involvement where everyone is doing a very small part so it is a sustainable effort and not a massive undertaking for a few. The dream is that the culmination of this effort will lead us to a finale of a field day next year.

In a minute we are going to open this up to the floor for discussion of both ideas and to see what resources we can pool to make those ideas happen.

Something important to remember as we move forward with cultivating new hams. Culture changes with every generation. What the greatest draw to our generation may not be what interests the next generation and we will need to keep an open mind to see what is working and what is not. Share your findings with the club, both success and failures. Maybe digital modes are a huge hit, maybe ISS and satellite is the great draw, potentially ARDEN, SSB, CW, who knows?

Here is a list of things to kick off the discussion.

1. 100 active members/how many inactive members?
 - a. All people currently at this meeting (or reading this report) should reach out to ALL members, active and inactive, and see how they are doing and invite them to events. The next one is the club picnic. Make sure to mention that families are welcome, that there will be kids there, and there is a playground next to the picnic area.
 - b. Everyone is welcome to the events, specifically focus on families/young families. Plan several additional events and outings that are family friendly. Some suggestions were fox hunting, antenna building, etc.

2. Boy and Girl Scouts/other versions of scouts.
 - a. There is a Radio Merit Badge. I personally am connecting with a troop. There is a good chance several troops will be interested and will need teachers/liaisons to pair with them.
 - b. I will be developing a curriculum that will fulfil the merit badge.
 - c. This will give opportunity for several outings as some of the things required are building antennas, fox hunting, performing QSOs.
 - d. We can also do additional events if there are groups that seem more interested than others
 - e. Can also branch into other badges that parallel ham radio like circuits and electronics.
 - f. I will be reaching out to the club to help pair willing volunteers with Troops/Patrols to help them through the badge. Potential contact Russ Mickiewicz, N7QR? Troop leader
 3. School ham radio club
 - a. My understanding is that schools have made things like this difficult but we should at least explore it.
 - b. Teachers here that would be willing to talk to the appropriate staff or electronics teacher about creating something like that. Any advice. Teachers here not necessarily required to do the club but any info that can be obtained would be helpful.
 - c. Community based Pota (or even sota) events with GOTA stations and such.
 - d. Home school groups
- Other ideas that were presented in the meeting
- Roland – Scavenger CW hunt
- Marty – Noted the Boy and Girl Scouts have a Scout Ham Jamboree Oct 14-16th
- Dan – Suggested finding Stem groups for kids/teens and partnering with them for a season
- Astronaut contact event
- Pico Balloon Event (balloon tracking) – potential resources Bruce or Jeff Sperley, Tech Or Sat @ PSU Engineering
- A committee was approved to drive this project but we will need help from everyone to make this happen. Please email me (contact info below) with any help you are willing to give. Some examples are

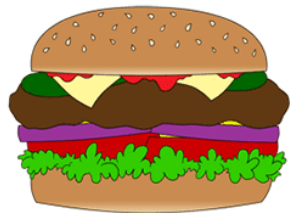
Treasurer's Report

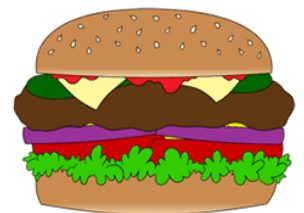

VE Testing for Ham Licenses

An amateur radio licensee must provide the FCC with an email address on all applications. If no email address is included, the FCC may dismiss the application as defective. The FCC will email a link to an official electronic copy of the license grant. An official copy will be available by accessing the licensee's password-protected Universal Licensing System account. You must also register in the FCC CORES system and receive a FCC Registration Number before exam day. Candidates could go directly to the FCC CORES User Account and Registration page: <https://apps.fcc.gov/cores/userLogin.do>. New license applicants should create an FCC user account and register their social security number in the FCC Commission Registration System before attending exams. Registrants will be assigned an FRN which will be used in all license transactions with the FCC. The current cost for taking a test is \$15 at the examination time. **Plus you will be assessed a \$35 from the FCC which must be paid within ten days.**
