We started Field Day off right with 12 of us getting together for some great Mexican food for lunch and then drew lots of attention as our caravan of RVs, antenna studded trailers, and misc. smaller antenna laden vehicles headed up to Larch Mountain. We arrived at the top where it looked like fairly fresh gravel had been laid and, surprisingly, somewhat leveled. The sun was out, a touch warm, but just enough to ensure the site was dry.

We positioned the trailers with the rear doors facing each other and constructed an entire pavilion's worth of pop ups to protect us from the sun and off the off chance that it rained (it is Oregon after all). Garret put all of the covers to shame with his wrap-around awning, although fortunately the weather was great all weekend so we did not have to deploy the sidewalls. Stations were quickly set up for final testing with Garret's Repeater book trailer hosting the 20m ssb on the flex 6600 and maestro and 10/80m digital on the Yaesu 710. George's trailer delivered an initial 20m cw on an external station using the KX3, the Icom 9700 for vhf and higher, and the maestro for 40m ssb. B'jaia also brought out his Yaesu HF rig and vertical antenna as well.

It's hard to choose just one thing that really was the best part of field day but I will say this. The Buddihexes were definitely in those top items. Assembly of the hex beams was incredibly easy, the raising and guying of the first was a bit more challenging but Alan came to the rescue and showed us how to do it for the second one. This was good because once we got that second one up we realized we had forgotten to attach the feedline and had to do the raising and guying a second time. The quadplexers were amazing, we had no issues at all running those multiple bands on the single antenna. I expected to have to adjust and tweak, we plugged them in though and never gave it a second thought from there.

There is one modification we are going to attempt and that is to further filter 20m cw from 20m SSB as there was bleed-over between the two beams

when on the same band but we have designs for building these specialty filters and will be looking into June 29th (operate then teardown). this in the coming months. Performance on the hex beams was incredible, we hit right around 900 contacts and all 50 states! The last two states squeaked in the last half hour with 9 year old Greyson pulling in Vermont on SSB and Alan for the final win with Rhode Island via CW. All honors to Gunner and Jenny, our reigning CW champions who must have made over a third of our CW contacts. If there was a CW station open, they were on it and easily doing 30-40wpm!

AREDN at field day is a must at this point. All know that the purpose of Field Day is to get out and practice, try, fail, and learn. We faced some challenges with certain portions of AR-EDN. Occasionally we would lose connection between logging computers, we discovered that if your FD N3FJP server matched another N3FJP server name and you are both using AREDN connected to the wider mesh that you can end up with entries in the wrong server! The inter station phone setup worked well but we faced some challenges with the PBX bringing in the external line. Finally, we discovered (far too late in the game) that a certain Cisco phone, in a certain podcaster's trailer, was transmitting a shocking amount of RFI. Apparently Grandstream is the way to go folks!

In my opinion this was an amazing Field Day, it was a great location, great attendance of between 30-40 people. This includes several non-ham visitors and the general public that either saw our sign driving by or were pulled in by our social media and neighborhood posts. We even had two USFS rangers stop by to thank us after one of our members, while on a short hike in the area, found them with a stalled vehicle, radioed into the site, and had the club send help to jump their very dead truck. Talk about Ham

Radio in action! I cannot wait for next year and all that we will do to improve on what we have built. Be proud HARC because we truly pulled off a memorable 6A field day!
