Technician Class Teachers Wanted

Do you like to build antennas? How about working digital contacts? Maybe you are into DX and know about propagation? Maybe you studied electronics or electricity? Maybe you are a stand up guy or gal that follows all the rules? These are just a few of the sections that ham radio technicians have on their license test.

Greetings everyone, as the Training Coordinator I am looking for a few members willing to assist in teaching a section or two. You do not need to be a professional teacher to help out, just someone willing to share your knowledge. The study material will be divided out and based on your expertise. We will be using Stu Turner's book with the accompanying Power Point slides. It is easy to teach and follow.

The class is typically two Saturdays in a row from 8:30am to around 4:pm. Each section takes between 45 minutes to an hour so you are not committed to all day. We can break up the class by chapters to keep things easy for everyone. Please contact me at kirkgoins@gmail.com if you are interested in teaching.

Now earlier I mentioned a Groups.io, what is that? Groups.io is an informal way to be able to talk, plan, and communicate with everyone in the club. It primarily uses your email and it allows you to specify if you want to be alerted to every message, just a daily summary, a weekly summary, really whatever suits your wants. This will not be replacing our official HARC emails but is a supplementary way to help bring in and communicate with our club members. There has been a flurry of activity on there as quite a few of our members have been making the most of our waning summer to enjoy POTA events! Electronic Testing for New Licenses

With the help of the free ExamTools website, it couldn't be easier or faster for HARC to offer inperson testing.

People start by using the "Find A Session" list at HamStudy.org to get registered for a test session and get their payment submitted. When they arrive on-site they get checked in, seated at a PC, and then are able to get started. The new system is able to provide them immediate feedback once they have passed and the VEs electronically sign their CSCE (Certificate of Successful Completion of Examination). Once the examination session is completed, the VE Team submits the data to the ARRL electronically as well which drastically improves how quickly new licenses and upgrades appear in the FCC database (sometimes within two business days).

MHCC has been very helpful and is allowing HARC to use the computer lab across from the classroom at the Fisheries Building.

If you are an Amateur Extra license holder and would like to help our VE team reach out to me at ve@wb7qiw.org and I'll help get you set up.

The next exam session for the Hoodview ARC VE team will be on September 20, 2025 at 9:00 AM at Mt Hood Community College Fisheries #1, Gresham, OR 97030.


