Santa Claus Net, Spreading Joy



Also, a MOBILE transmitter hunt will be same day January 17, 2026. Two transmitters will be placed on private property in EAST Portland. The transmitters will be on the air by 9:00 AM and run all day or until the batteries give out. A QR code will be visible from the street and scannable from the sidewalk. No need to enter the private property or climb fences etc. Scan the QR code and log your find.

You do not need to start at the MHCC campus, you can start from wherever you can hear the transmitter. Pick a high point and take a bearing, such as Rocky Butte or MT. Tabor.

An email will be sent before the hunt with frequencies, etc.

The Hunt will be CANCELED if it is icy and the campus is closed.

Hoodview Amateur Radio Club 1976-2026 Fifty Years of East County Radioing

The club has reached fifty years of age this year. I will be printing some of the text from the club's historian book in the newsletter this year to remember some of the highlights.

Preface from the Club's History 1976-1993

The history of the Hoodview Amateur Radio Club has pointed out many things that made the club successful from its very beginning. First, there was a desire of the members to succeed in making the club strong and active. Second, members accepted responsibility for appointed or elected offices, Third, the members were innovative.

It is fortunate that information was available from secretaries minutes, board minutes and newsletters to assemble a document of the club's history.

It was the intent of the historian to capture as many of the events, club officers for each year and

club actions to home the club into a great club.

This document took about one year to assemble. It required much research from many avenues to attain as accurate as possible document. It is hope that some of the ideas that had been tried in the past can be explored and tried again.

One thing that stands out most were the outstanding articles on DX activity by W7GUR, Jim; electronic phenomena and "how to" projects by W7TWL, Ed; packet radio and repeater up dates by KA7AGH, Jim and KB7KBT, Garrey; computer and radio articles by KB7ULU, Larry; slow speed net by KB7TTY, Bob; emergency services by WT7S, Buck; and many others. The VE Testing program started by WA7IIM, Armand and the many instructors that taught amateur radio classes so members and visitors could upgrade in FCC licensing require many hours by dedicated Hoodview Amateur Radio Club members.

Hopefully the success of Hoodview Amateur Radio Club will always be looked upon as a pillar of Amateur Radio.
